Spring into Safety: Keeping Your Pets Happy & Healthy This Season

At South Metro Animal Emergency Care, we see an increase in cases involving toxin exposures (like lilies and fertilizers), pet injuries from outdoor adventures, and allergic reactions triggered by pollen and insect bites.



SPRINGTIME PET EMERGENCIES AND HELPFUL TIPS

- As temperatures rise, we see an increase in cases related to spring hazards. Common emergencies during this time of year include toxin ingestions (lilies, fertilizers, pesticides), allergic reactions, heat stroke, blue algae toxicity, and other outdoor injuries.
- Be aware of when your neighbors or local parks are spraying pesticides. Keep your pet indoors during these times, or check to ensure that treated areas are safe before allowing them outside.
- Many types of lilies, particularly Easter lilies, are toxic to cats. Ingesting even a small amount can cause kidney failure, so be cautious if you have lilies in your home.
- Spring allergies can affect your pets too. Watch for signs like excessive itching, swelling, or difficulty breathing, which could indicate an allergic reaction to pollen, insect bites, or other allergens.
- Springtime adventures can lead to unpredictable situations. Always keep your dog on a leash to prevent encounters with wildlife or dangerous situations like busy roads or other aggressive animals.
