WINTER PET EMERGENCIES AND HELPFUL TIPS



As winter lingers, we see an increase in seasonal hazards for pets. Common emergencies this time of year include antifreeze and rodenticide toxicity, paw injuries from ice and salt, cold exposure, and slips on icy surfaces.

✿ Watch for Ice Melt & Chemicals

Ice melt, antifreeze, and de-icing agents are highly toxic. Wipe paws after walks and keep spills cleaned up immediately. Boots can help ice melt from getting into paw pads.

▣ Cold Weather & Icy Conditions

Snow and ice increase the risk of falls, strains, and frostbite—especially for smaller or senior pets. Appropriate weather wear can help combat the cold, but limit time outside in extreme cold when possible.

牿 Leash Up in Changing Conditions

Snowbanks, melting ice, and increased wildlife movement make leashing important to prevent injuries and unexpected encounters.
